- 2. Many Blue Ox® Baseplates are designed to use existing holes and hardware to mount the baseplate to the towed vehicle. Even though bolts are there, do not assume they are adequate for baseplate mounting. Always use hardware supplied in the hardware kit and existing hardware specified in the Baseplate Installation Instructions.

Confirm the towability and pre-towing procedures for your vehicle with the owner's manual or contact the vehicle's manufacturer for specific towing procedures.



Standard Tab Spacing Guidelines:

To use certain adapters or a RangeFinder II tow bar in conjunction with standard tab baseplates an additional 5/16" hole must be drilled in the attachment tabs. The Ambassador tow bar will require an adapter for attachment tabs that are not 24" wide. The Adventurer tow bar will require an adapter for attachment tabs that are less than 24" wide. The Acclaim tow bar will not fold and store without the use of an adapter on vehicles with attachment tabs less than 24" wide. The BX88152 adapter cannot be used with this baseplate.

Instructions:

These vehicles weigh is over 3500 lbs. and require a class III 5,000 lb rated tow bar, hitch and accessories. Utilization of Blue Ox baseplates with any other tow bar not approved by Automatic Equipment Manufacturing Company invalidates the limited warranty.

Installation of this baseplate requires removing the belly pan and plastic air dam from the vehicle. A small amount of trimming may need to be done to the air dam. Drilling is required.

The dimensional variations between otherwise identical vehicles can be considerable. While the baseplate was designed for easy installation, it may be necessary to tailor the baseplate slightly to compensate for auto manufacturer's tolerances. These minor adjustments may include filing a hole slightly, bending electrical rods, and/ or bending end plates.

Installation Instructions

- 1. Read the Baseplate General Instructions Sheet included with this baseplate.
- 2. Use a 7MM socket to remove the three screws that attach the belly pan underneath the radiator. Remove the belly pan. Set belly pan and screws aside to be reinstalled later.
- 3. Remove the plastic air dam underneath the metal bumper. Use an 8MM socket to remove the eight screws, and a flat screwdriver to remove the three plastic pushpins, from the top of the air dam. Set these pushpins aside to be reinstalled later.
- 4. The lower slots on the end of the end mounts of the baseplate will match up with a slot on the bottom of the frame rails. Guide a nut plate up through the slot and position the plate inside the frame rail and over the slot, with the weld nut up.
- 5. Notice the bumper mounts on the end of the frame rails. There is a horizontal mount welded to the frame rails and a vertical flat to the inside of the frame rails. The vertical flat is bolted to the bumper at each end. Use a 13MM socket to remove the bottom bolt from both vertical mounts. THESE BOLTS WILL NOT BE USED OR REPLACED FOR THE BASEPLATE INSTALLATION.

- 6. With an assistant, hold the baseplate up to the bottom of the frame rails. Apply LOCTITE Red to the threads of the 10MM x 35MM bolts and start them, along with a 10MM lock washer, into the vertical mount holes just exposed. If these two holes do not appear to be centered on the frame rails of the vehicle, use an 18MM socket to loosen the large bolts on the horizontal, welded mount discussed in the previous step. These bolts are in large horizontal slots so the metal bumper can be moved to the side, if necessary, to center it with the frame rails. There will be two bolts on each mount. **NOTE:**Some models have hoses extending up in front of the radiator. Push the hoses back making sure not to bend the machined fitting/tubing on the lower piece of the hoses.
- 7. Once the 10MM bolts are started, apply LOCTITE Red to the 1/2 x 1 3/4" bolts and start it through the slots on the outside of the frame rail. Run the bolts through the frame rail and out through the slots on the side of the baseplate end mount with a 1/2" flat washer and 1/2" lock washer fastened to nut plates, but **DO NOT TIGHTEN THE BOLTS COMPLETELY YET.** Do this to both sides of the vehicle.
- 8. Place a 1/2" lock and flat washer on a 1/2 x 1 3/4 bolt, apply LOCTITE Red, and start the bolt through the bottom slot and into the nut plate. **DO NOT TIGHTEN THE BOLTS COMPLETELY YET.** Do this to both sides of the vehicle.
- 9. When all the bolts have been started, use a 17MM socket to tighten the 10MM bolts. Then use a 3/4" socket and short extension to tighten the bolts into the nut plates. When all bolts are tight, use the 18MM socket to tighten the bolts in the bumper if they were loosened from step 7. Be sure to use LOCTITE Red on ALL bolts before tightening. Tighten all bolts according to the torque chart in the General Instruction sheet.
- 10. Using the baseplate as a template, drill that back hole with the 17/32" drill bit. Insert the 1/2-13 whiz nut with wire through the end of the frame rail to align with the drilled hole and tighten the 1/2-13 hex bolt with the lock washer. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.
- 11. Insert the 1/2-13 whiz nut with the wire into the hole to align with the drilled hole, tighten 1/2-13 hex bolt and lock washer. Do this to both sides of the vehicle. Be sure to use LOCTITE Red on ALL bolts before tightening. Tighten all bolts according to the torque chart in the General Instruction sheet.
- 12. The air dam can now be reinstalled onto the bumper. A very small amount of trimming may be necessary. Use a utility knife to trim a small slot in the back of the air dam to allow access for the baseplate bumper mounts.

13. On the driver and passenger side mounts there is a 3/8" hole that matches up to a solid section of the tie down. Using the hole in the mounts as a template, drill a 13/32" hole through the tie down bracket on both sides of the car.

When using power drills be aware of the dangers of torque and drill bit length.

14. With the holes drilled, bolt the mount to the tie down using a 3/8-16 x 1" bolt, lock nut, and LOCTITE Red. Tighten securely.

Install the tow bar and safety cables according to the instructions included in their packages.

Do not substitute other devices if the tow bar pin and clip are lost.

General Information

- 1. Ensure that your product(s) are registered online at www.blueox.com. It is crucial to register your product(s) so that you may be alerted of product offerings, updates, upgrades, maintenance and safety bulletins, and/ or recalls.
- 2. It is the owner's responsibility to inspect all towing equipment for cracked welds, missing or worn parts and loose bolts before each towing trip. Be sure to use Loctite® Red on all bolts and tighten to the recommended specifications.
- 3. It is the owner's responsibility to hook up all towing equipment per manufacturer's instructions/recommendations.
- 4. Remove the attachment tabs when not in use (if applicable).

Notice To Baseplate Installer

- 1. It is YOUR responsibility to watch for:
 - Oil cooler and air conditioner lines
 - Electrical wires and hoses
 - Missing parts or attaching points on the frame
 - ** If the baseplate is improperly installed and is against a wire or hose, it could cause fluid leaks or electrical shorts some time after the actual baseplate installation.

Permanent Baseplate Safety Cable Installation

Permanent baseplate safety cables are strongly recommended when towing a vehicle with a tow bar. The principle function of the permanent baseplate safety cables is to prevent the towed vehicle from breaking loose in the event the connection between the frame of the towed vehicle and the baseplate fails or becomes disconnected. The cables must be connected from the baseplate to the frame rail or cross member of the vehicle's frame. The illustrations below show the possible arrangements recommended by Blue Ox®. Each permanent baseplate safety cable must have an adequate weight rating for the towing system. The weight rating of the two (2) cables together will not qualify.

Do not mount the permanent baseplate safety cables against wires, hoses or brake lines.

These permanent baseplate safety cables should remain installed as long as the baseplate is installed on the vehicle. Permanent baseplate safety cables are to be used in conjunction with, and NOT a replacement for legally required safety cables attaching the towed vehicle to the towing vehicle.
